Curriculum Vitae: Robyn M Webster

My practice continually questions and respectfully explores ways of being a pakeha artist within biculturalism. not only because I live and work in Aotearoa, but because of my extensive and prolonged engagement with harakeke / NZ flax / Phormium Tenax.

My practice is fuelled by a constant shifting between two and three dimensions. It is a prolonged experiment in boundary riding. Between art and craft, image and object, natural fibre and man-made materials, the precious and the valueless, and the use of feminine craft practices such as weaving, plaiting and stitching, to make fine art. It's about the transformation of materials through my labour and by association. In my sculptural work I have mostly explored rigidity with flexibility, by using tension and gravity, usually to open soft forms or to evoke movement. Sometimes movement has been paramount, in which case I have collaborated with dancers and musicians; the people supply the movement. My printmaking has evolved to employ harakeke as a drawing medium from which to print. My paintings have evolved to bridge the other two fields. I like to recycle ideas and materials in new ways, seeking connection and emotional resonance in a way that is of use to the world.
